ARMISTICE DAY, Sunday 11 November 2018.

Armistice Day commemorates the ending of the First World War. The announcement was made “at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month” 1918. This year marks the centenary of this event, and the New Zealand Government asks all citizens to keep TWO MINUTES of silence at 11.00 am on Sunday, 11 November, as we remember all who died in that War and in all wars. At 11.02 am bells will throughout the nation, as happened in 1918. Churches are invited to join this celebration with the ringing of Church bells and hand bells.

Choral Mass for the Eve of Armistice: Saturday 10 November at 7.30 pm at St Patrick’s Cathedral, Auckland.

Bishop Patrick Dunn, President of the New Zealand Catholic Bishops Conference commented, “the paper is substantial and so we need time to read it and give it careful consideration. However, we must not lose sight of two key facts in this discussion. As we argued in our recent submission to the Law Commission, abortion is both a health and justice issue and our laws should continue to treat abortion as such. There are always at least two human lives involved – the unborn human person and the mother. The current abortion regime recognises this. (Full statement available in the Church porch.)
