The Most Holy Trinity

There's a story about St Augustine that fits nicely with our celebration of the Trinity this Sunday. According to the story, the great man was walking along a beach, pondering the mystery of the Trinity and trying to comprehend it. Coming across a young boy pouring water into a hole, Augustine asked what he was doing. "I'm trying to pour the ocean into this hole." "You'll never pour the whole ocean into that hole", scoffed Augustine. "And you'll never understand the Trinity" the boy replied, before vanishing.

It's fair to say that trying to understanding the makeup of God is an exercise in impossibility—it's something which simply surpasses our ability to understand it. In our creed, we profess belief in One God in three persons—Father, Son and Holy Spirit— even though the way in which God is three but also one, is something which remains elusive dispute whatever efforts we might make to understand it. What we can understand though is love; the experience of loving and being loved—something which all of us have known at some time in our lives at least. Despite a modern tendency to reduce the meaning of everything to the level of individual experiences, love is something which can't be reduced in this way. Although our experiences of love will all of course be different, we all know that love is something greater than this, that it's meaning is more than just whatever we make of it. As St John puts it, God is love; and the relationship between the members of the Trinity is one of love: the lover, the beloved and the love between them. Love isn't just a feeling or a word, it's an action and so the experience of being loved by God and, in turn sharing that love with others draws us into the intimate relationship of the Trinity— God dwelling in us and us in God.
