Certainly, it's fair to say that knowledge of the existence and content of the Catechism of the Catholic Church is far greater than that of the Compendium of Catholic Social Teaching. For all of that, a fundamental part of what we as Catholics believe—that we are not saved by faith alone but by faith and works; faith without works is dead. Sadly however, the focus of our faith can too often be on <i>what</i> we believe rather than on how we live out that belief. Not for nothing though, during the ordination of a deacon when he is presented with the Book of the Gospels, is he commended to “believe what you read, teach what you believe and practise what you teach” – a command which applies equally to all of us. To do this however, social justice needs to be about more than simply “doing good”. Too often though it is reduced to this and, as a result, loses much of its significance and importance. Instead, it needs to be an essential part of our relationship with God and, especially, a part of our participation in the Eucharist. In every mass, when we receive the Eucharist, Christ gives himself to us from the cross and we in turn become members of the one body by means of the one bread, which when responded to fully, moves us to recognise the Lord in those who hunger as we do in the tabernacle. So if we simply see social justice as being about the so-called “golden rule” or being nice to others, we're only barely scratching the surface (at best) of its meaning and significance for our lives and faith.
