20 years ago, in his message for World Youth Day, St John Paul II (as he now is) commanded the young people of the world, "do not be afraid to be the saints of the new millennium! Be contemplative, love prayer; be coherent with your faith and generous in the service of your brothers and sisters, be active members of the Church and builders of peace". In order to fulfil this demanding task, he went on to urge them to use the gifts of the Church as a source of strength and support, saying, "continue to listen to His Word, draw strength from the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist and Penance". This task of being "intrepid apostles of [the] Gospel" and "builders of a new humanity" as St John Paul II put it, is one which applies to us all. Each of us is called to be a saint. Granted, that seems like an almost impossible ask, but, in part, that's because we sometimes see saints as being super-holy superheroes, whose faith far surpasses us ordinary folks. If this were true however, it would defeat the whole purpose of having saints since they're supposed to serve as examples to inspire us to imitate them and that's not going to happen unless we first see them as being like us. This is why some of my favourite saints are striking in their ordinariness: St Benedict Joseph Labre (a mentally-ill homeless man) and Saints Jacinta and Francisco Marto (the Fatima children). All Saints Day honours and acknowledges not just the canonised saints—those formally acknowledged by the church as being in heaven—but also other saints: those who have gone before us signed with the sign of faith and who encourage us by the example of their lives. We pray to saints asking them to pray for us, to help us, encourage us and inspire us so that we too might come to join them as saints among saints in the halls of heaven.
