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Radical discipleship is an expression which is probably overused, to the point where it loses its radicalism. Certainly, we're called to be disciples of Christ—imitating and not just following him—and our way of life should consequently be very different to the world we live in. However, there's a risk of our discipleship becoming a feedback loop—that is, where outputs are feed back into the system as inputs as part of a chain of cause-and-effect that forms a circuit or loop. In other words, what we do simply becomes all about us. Jesus' parable in this Sunday's gospel is however intended to shatter our misconception about what discipleship should be about. While the question of "who is my neighbour?" is the immediate prompt for the parable, Jesus may also have had in mind James' and John's desire to immolate the Samaritan village which rejected them—as recounted in our gospel a few Sundays back. At its heart, the parable—easily one of Jesus' best known—is about redemption of the lost through the love of God. Like any good story-telling Rabbi, however, Jesus makes sure his message sticks by making it memorable, or, more accurately, shocking. This message isn't just that salvation is open to all but also that we who follow Christ are called to proclaim that message with our actions at least as much as our words. In other words, it is insufficient for us simply to wait for those who do not acknowledge Christ, or who have wandered away from him to come around (with the threat of fire from heaven if they don't) but rather for us to go out and meet them where they're at, without leaving them there. Doing so might seem a waste of time, with our efforts better spent on building up the faith of those who believe; but the clear message from the parable is that this is not how God is and so neither should it be how we are.
