<u>ISAIAH</u> 66:10-14	<u>GALATIANS</u> 6:14-18	<u>LUKE</u> 10:1-12,17-20

The instructions Jesus gave to the 72 in this Sunday's gospel is vastly different from the attitude of James and John in last week's gospel. Those villages which reject the gospel when it is proclaimed to them will not be smited with fire from heaven but rather the dust will simply be shaken from the disciples' feet—a serious act certainly, but one which is a world apart from incineration. As our Collect (opening prayer) reminds us though, it was from the abasement of His Son that God the Father raised up a fallen world. While the word "abasement" may not be used much (if at all) these days, it conveys the significance of Christ's suffering and death on the cross, since it refers to the infliction of humiliation or degradation on a person. In Jesus' case, he takes this upon himself; as St Paul puts it, humbling himself to become obedient unto death, even death on a cross. That's not to say of course that Jesus isn't, as he says, sending the 72 (and us) out like lambs among wolves but, at the same time, the instruction to take nothing with them is intended to ensure that they rely on the help of God, rather than their own strength. This help, though, doesn't take the form of fire from heaven, or any sort of show of worldly power; rather, it is instead about peace—something which the world cannot give. Peace though isn't just the absence of conflict but rather an inner sense of contentment—trusting ourselves totally to the Father's care. We can only gain this, though, through a relationship with Christ, as I said last week. Faith isn't simply about following Christ, it's about imitating him, especially in his humility. By submitting to Christ, just as He Himself submitted totally to the Father's will. Through Christ, as St Paul says, we become a new creature—dying to our old selves and boasting only in the cross, as we give ourselves to the mission of Christ. *Blessings, Fr Anthony*
