We have now entered Passiontide and the beginning of Holy Week, we now journey with Jesus up to Jerusalem, we journey with Jesus into the holy city and we join the welcoming crowds. We welcome Jesus into Jerusalem as the King of Peace and the King of Kings. We receive blessed palms this week which are very special to us. We take them with us as a sign of our devotion and love for Jesus our King. It is a visible sign that we desire Jesus to come into our hearts anew, to take his rightful place in our life. The palms from Palm Sunday are a sign that we are united with Jesus in his mission. We keep the blessed palms in our home as a reminder of the great love and the great sacrifice that Jesus took upon himself for our sake.

We are in the final stretch of Lent, this is the sixth Sunday since Ash Wednesday, we have all walked with Christ through our prayer, sacrifices and charity and now we have the last few steps to go. As we enter this Holy Week, I invite you to take a little bit of time during the week just to think about where Jesus was during his passion. Perhaps you might consider placing yourself in the scene, for example, on Thursday, where are you during the preparation for the last supper, or where are you when Jesus is praying in the Garden? This week we have the challenging task of meditating on Christ's passion so that in sharing in Christ's Cross, albeit in a small way, we might also share in the resurrection and the glory yet to come.

Catechism of the Catholic Church: IN BRIEF

1677 Sacramentals are sacred signs instituted by the Church. They prepare men to receive the fruit of the sacraments and sanctify different circumstances of life.

1678 Among the sacramentals blessings occupy an important place. They include both praise of God for his works and gifts, and the Church's intercession for men that they may be able to use God's gifts according to the spirit of the Gospel.

1679 In addition to the liturgy, Christian life is nourished by various forms of popular piety, rooted in the different cultures. While carefully clarifying them in the light of faith, the Church fosters the forms of popular piety that express an evangelical instinct and a human wisdom and that enrich Christian life.
